# RESILIENT LITTLE SCHOLARS AGAINST ALL ODDS




Keeping alive its motto of "SERVICE BEFORE SELF", our school has consistently making headlines in every aspect of teaching and learning.

I am dying to take a road trip to Nainital. Since lockdown, this is all I am missing. Those impromptu trips, late evening Maggi sessions, being a wanderlust by heart & soul, my mind is blowing with it, for the past 3 months. Life has come to a standstill. Nowhere to go & nothing to do. Late evening strolls have been replaced by badminton tournaments on the terrace. Lockdown has made most of the people turn domestic. 
