Guidelines for Parents:-
In order to secure the best education of your child, maximum co-operation and interaction between parents, school faculty and management is necessary. This is primarily through Parent-Teachers meeting and the school diary which every child must carry to school everyday. We earnestly recommend that parents or guardians to look into their child's school diary everyday, and see to it that the lesson and home work assigned for the next day is done. The children should be encouraged to cultivate neatness in every sphere. Remarks and notices sent through the diary should be seen and counter signed regularly. Criticism of your child's teacher or the school in his/her presence should be studiously avoided, because it causes the child to lose respect for the teacher. If you have a legitimate complaint, see the management or report the same in writing. As the medium of instruction in the school is English, boys and girls must be encouraged to do a certain amount of regular English conversation and reading even at home. The school insists on strict punctuality, regular school attendance, cleanliness in dress, regular study and submission of assignments. Absence from school for merely social functions is strongly discouraged. If a child has missed some work due to absence, the parents must ensure that the child covers the work he / she has missed. Children who suffer from any kind of infectious or contagious disease will not be permitted in school till the doctor's permission is obtained.

Very Important

- 1. Any parent withdrawing his / her child for whatever reason must serve one month's written notice otherwise the child's security money will be adjusted against fees for the period of non-attendance till issue of T.C.
- 2. Any child found to be indisciplined, rowdy or involved in vandalism or vulgar activities in the school bus will be debarred from using the school bus. He / she may be asked to get off the bus immediately and take a local bus home.
- 3. Conversation in English is mandatory for all in school campus.
- 4. Any damage to school property will be punishable by way of paying a fine.
- 5. Mobiles, Cars or motorcycles / scooters are totally banned for use by school children in the school. These will be confiscated & returned to the parents only after payment of a fine.
- 6. Any child whose attendance falls below 75% till Dec, for classes IX to XII will not be allowed to appear for the final exams in accordance with the CBSE rules. Any child short of this attendance will require special permission from the CBSE which will have to do obtained by the parents.
- 7. No child is allowed to change his / her allotted bus without a written permission from the Principal.
- 8. Narrow & low base Trousers & coloured hair are strictly prohibited in school.
- 9. Very short kurtas, (for girls) & coloured hair are not allowed. Hair plaits are compulsory for girls.
- 10. Any child misbehaving in the bus with any teacher, driver, conductor or other children may be debarred from using the school bus.

PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEE:-

Fees is charged for two months at a time. Every second month the fee bill is given to the child on the Ist working day & is to be paid timely in the account mentioned.

Fees must be paid before the 26th of every due month. A fine of Rs.50 will be charged for late payment. If a student does not pay the fee for 4 months, his / her name shall be struck off from the school rolls. If the child is to continue to study in the school, readdmission will be required. Students may not be allowed to sit for examinations without the payment of fees.

After depositing the fees the school copy must be submitted in the school office before the last date of fee submission.

One month prior notice will have to be given before a child is removed from the school.

SCHOOL RULES

CODE OF CONDUCT

- The school will not meet any person representing the student other then the parents or legal guardians.
- Any misbehaviour of parents, legal guardians with the school staff may lead to the cancellation of their ward's name from the School roster.
- Smoking, betel chewing, spitting etc. In the school premises is prohibited.
- Children must be punctual and regular to School. Leave of absence must be applied for.
- Children are not allowed to wear jewellery or bring valuables to school.
- Children should be habitually clean and neatly dressed. The school uniform is to be worn on all days. A student who comes to School out of uniform will be punished.
- Students are responsible for all school property. Students should not spoil the desks or chairs, damage any school furniture scribble anything on the school walls or break window panes. Any damage done should be reported at once to the class teacher. Vandalism will be penalised.
- No reading materials (other than prescribed text books) should be brought to school without permission.
- Money should not be lent or borrowed by the student and articles should not be exchanged between the students. The school will take a serious note of this offence.
- Running, playing, shouting and unruly behaviour inside the school building is not allowed.
- Parents and guardians are not permitted to enter the class rooms.
- No pupil will leave the school premises during the school hours without prior permission of the Principal.
- The school reserves the right to advise the parents to withdraw their child if his/her progress in studies is unsatisfactory of his/her attendance is irregular or his/her conduct is harmful to other students.
- Honesty, cleanliness of dress and loyalty to school are demanded and expected of each student.
- ❖ Immorality, insubordination ,contempt of authority or wilful damage to property will be a sufficient reason for immediate expulsion of the student.
- Parents should see that their child has been administered triple antigen, polio vaccine and immunized against measles.
- Students are admitted in the school at their own risk. The school will not be responsible for any injury or loss of books, stationery or any other article.
- Student is not allowed to bring mobile phone to school.
 Bullying is strictly prohibited inside the school premises and no such act will go unnoticed or unpunished.

LIBRARY RULES:-

- Students must maintain absolute silence in the library.
- Students are expected to handle the library books with care.
- ❖ Books marked, disfigured or damaged will have to be replaced or paid by the borrower. For the loss of a book, the market price will be charged.
- * Text books, magazines and reference books will not be issued.

TRANSPORT RULES

- The school bus service is available for all students on specific routes.
- Bus fees will be paid by parents as per fee rules.
- At the end of the Academic Session, i.e. by 31st March, parents must apply in writing for withdraw from bus if required, failing which bus fee will be charged from April, as per approved rates.
- > Bus drivers are authorized to stop the bus only at designated stops. Routes and stops are approved by the school and parents must survey the route prior to selecting a bus stop. Request for a change in route/stop will not be entertained. The list of stops is made keeping in view the convenience and safety of all bus commuters. No diversion/extension will be entertained on existing routes.
- > Students are expected to behave in a courteous manner in the bus. They should not throw trash/food inside or outside the bus. They should be seated when the bus is in motion and follow the instructions of the Teacher in charge.
- In case of any emergency, parents must contact the School office, which will take the necessary action in contacting the person in charge of a particular bus.
- Any child misbehaving in the bus with any teacher, driver, conductor or other children may be debarred from using the school bus.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

The school has a prescribed uniform and all children are required to be properly dressed.

SUMMER UNIFORM:

(for all days except Monday and Friday)

- Grey Shorts/ Trousers/ Skirts/ Salwar
- Sky blue Shirt with School crest/ Kameez
- Grey Socks
- Black Shoes
- School Belt / dupatta with crest

WINTER UNIFORM: Same as summer uniform with School Tie, Sweater and Blazer.

For Monday and Friday the Uniform is:

- House Shirt
 * White Shorts/ divided Skirts
- White Socks * White Shoes
- 1. A child coming to school out of uniform without a valid reason will be charged a fine of Rs.20/- & subsequently this fine will be doubled.
- 2. All blazers and pullovers must have the child's name and class clearly visible on the their inner pockets of the blazers and bellow back of the pull over.

THE HOUSE SYSTEM:-

The students of classes II to XII are members of houses allotted to them. The house system plays an important role in promoting the cultural and co-curricular activities of the school. The houses conduct functions to celebrate important days and events. Inter-House competitions are periodically conducted to motivate students to take part in debates, declamations and other activities. Besides this, the students play inter-house matches in team games- cricket, basketball, football, volley ball, athletics etc..

HOUSE MEETING:-

House activities for children are differently planned. It is mandatory for students to take part in House activities and bring the required material on the allotted days, which is Monday and Friday. They are expected to wear the prescribed house uniforms for winter and summer.

The four Houses of the school, function under the supervision of House Masters/Mistresses. The Houses are named as under:-

1. Ganga House

2. Yamuna House

3. Krishna House

4. Kaveri House.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:-

- 1 .Extra Curricular activities like Music, Dance, Art, Clay, Gymnastics and Yoga are organized for all students.
- 2. The Physically Education Department of the school imparts training to students in sports like cricket, football Volly ball, khokho and basketball, besides conducting classes in physical training on a regular basis, and are function documented in PEC cards
- 3. As an integral part of the school curriculum, excursions and educational tours are organized periodically for students of all classes, who are escorted by the teachers of the school.
- 4. It is mandatory for the students to participate either in the sports day or the annual fuction.

ADVISORY:-

- All parents are requested to impart health education to their wards. Children must bathe daily and be taught to clean their eyes, ears and nose properly. Teeth must be brushed twice daily and nails trimmed weekly.
- ➤ Children should wear clean under garments and come neatly dressed to school.
- ➤ Hair must be checked for lice once a fortnight and boys must get a haircut on a regular basis.
- On your family physician's advice, de-worm your child at least once a year.
- Ensure they sleep eight hours a day and exercise daily.
- > Get a dental or ophthalmic check done once a year.
- ➤ Have a balanced diet rich in proteins and milk, drink water which is either boiled or filtered and carry it to school in their own water bottles.
- > Tiffin must be properly packed and napkins given.
- Children must carry disposable tissues/handkerchiefs when suffering from cold.
- In case of allergies or ailments, details of the treatment being given to the child or any emergency treatment required, must be left with the School.
